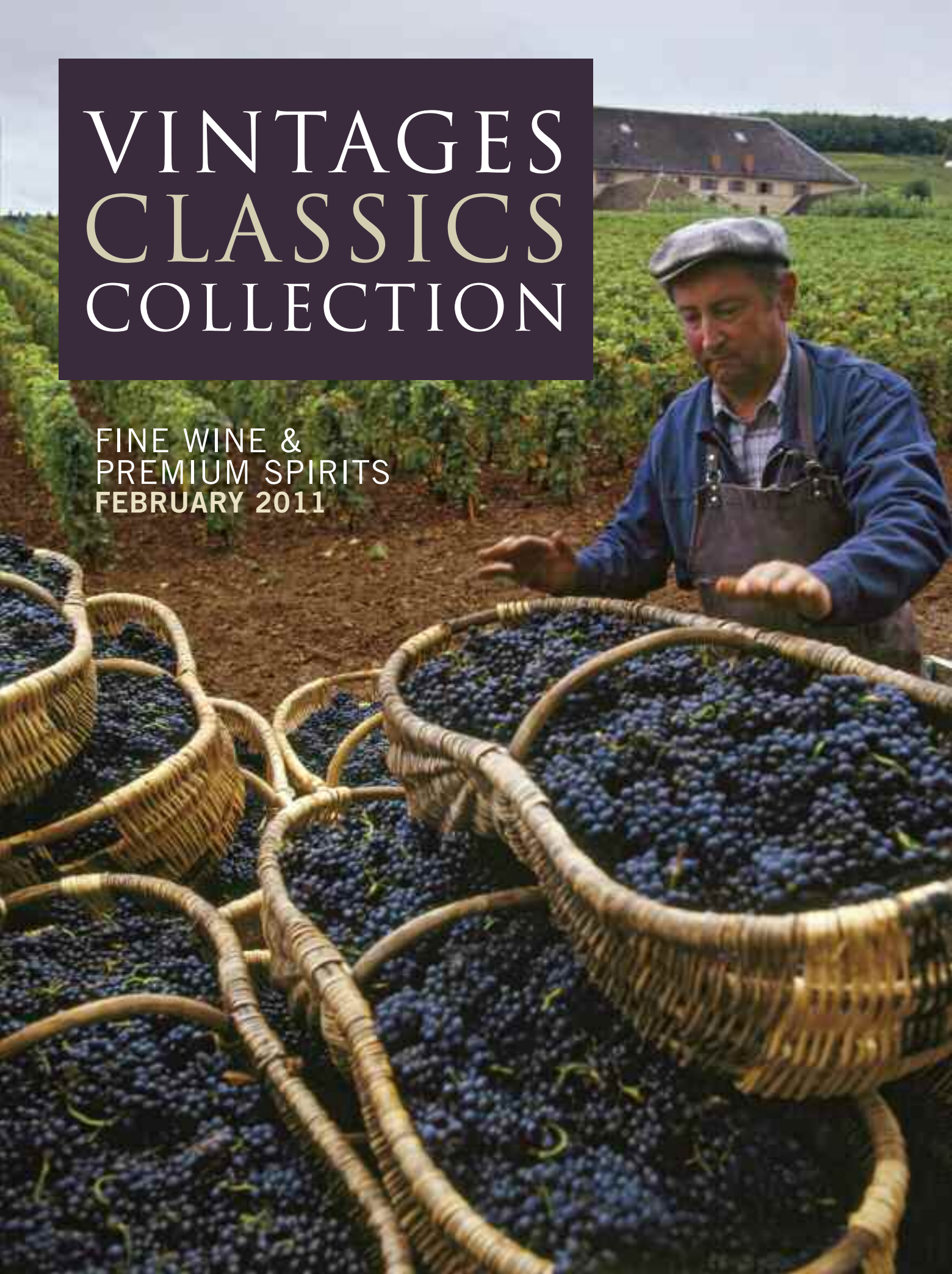

BURGUNDY

REFLECTIONS OF BEAUTIFUL TERROIR

It is said that of all human endeavours, the growing and making of wine most artfully expresses our deep connection with the land. This is the allure of the great wines of Burgundy. Adored for their elegance, eloquence, and aerial grace, they are true reflections of the land, capable of speaking directly to the heart.

“Wine-making is a natural process which does not strictly require any human intervention ... humanity’s role is a more modest one, to refine and guide.” So asserts Jancis Robinson, MW, in her *Oxford Companion to Wine*, and this concept is central to the Burgundian winemaking philosophy and approach. Here winemakers strive to express the complex nuances of terroir, rather than simply overloading the senses and diluting a wine’s inherent character and beauty. The wines of Burgundy are subtle creatures, not always easily understood, yet getting to know their intricacies is an infinitely rewarding experience. The Burgundians have been able to effectively channel the spirit of the land into wines that speak of the place they call home.

Great wines also speak of time. With each vintage, the nature of the growing season is etched on the finished wine. In the variable climate of Burgundy, this means a share of more challenging vintages, such as 2007 or '08, where greatness is achieved only by skilled growers and winemakers capable of feeling the pulse of terroir and acting accordingly. It is precisely this calibre of wine we’ve collected here, and this is why vintages such as 2007 and 2008 are particularly exciting: not only are they wines suitable for enjoyment with minimal cellaring – '07 wines blossomed after a year in bottle, while the wines of '08 were gorgeous immediately, though the best will last years – they are also a tangible reminder of the artistry at the heart and soul of Burgundian winemaking.

TASTING NOTE: A 3.5 ha monopole with 30+ year old vines ... Here the nose is not reduced and displays really lovely if reserved notes of the vegetal, earth, floral and a touch of the sauvage on the fresh and cool red pinot fruit aromas that precede the round, pure and relatively supple flavors that possess a textured mouth feel and more complexity on the serious, frank and direct if not especially rustic finish. A small but clear step up. Drink: 2015+. Score: **89-92** (Allen Meadows, www.burghound.com, Jan. 30, 2010)

TASTING NOTE: Tasted out of barrel at the Domaine. With a majority of fruit sourced from 26-year old vines in "Les Pourroux", this has a gentle, reticent nose at first that unfurls to offer raspberry, wild strawberry, a touch of iron filings developing with aeration. The palate is medium-bodied with smooth, rounded, slightly chewy tannins, lovely touch of cassis on the entry, harmonious with some pure cherry and redcurrant fruit towards the finish that is already demonstrating good weight and length. Good potential here – highly recommended. Score: **89-91** (Neal Martin, www.erobertparker.com, March 2010)

Stephen Tanzer, of *International Wine Cellar*, gave this wine a score of **91** (March/April 2010).

TASTING NOTE: The Bellene 2008 Clos de la Roche (of which there is the impressive amount of seven barrels, all new) smells of red raspberries in fresh and confitured form, soy, caramel, and resin. Pure, juicy, sweet fruit along with soy, cherry pit and chalk accents come up against rather gum-numbing tannins on the palate and for all of the sheer length exhibited here the wine never lets you forget its 100% new oak. Still, there is a lot to like already; the potential for ten or a dozen years' reward in bottle; and the possibility – if less than a promise – of more finesse and complexity over time. TASTING NOTE: A cool and retiring nose of wood spice, ripe red berry fruit, limestone, dried flowers and an interesting hint of dried ginger root merges into concentrated and notably powerful flavors that offer up excellent intensity and more minerality on the dusty, understated and linear finish that is impressively persistent. TASTING NOTE: Here the wood spice is no longer subtle though neither does it dominate the complex and relatively high-toned nose that is ripe and pretty while showcasing lovely red and dark berry fruit aromas amply laced with earth and underbrush notes that are also picked up by the detailed and strikingly long full-bodied flavors that possess plenty of palate staining extract. This is a bit oaky for me but there is no question that this is a wine of real quality that should repay up to a decade of cellar time. Drink 2013+. Noticeable wood stops short of dominating the otherwise fresh and airy black cherry and wet stone suffused nose that is very much in keeping with the rich, full-bodied and overtly muscular flavors brimming with dry extract and ample power on the impressively long and mineral-driven finish. This is a classic Rugiens in every respect, not the least of which is the amount of time that this will require to reach its apogee. Not the last word in complexity, but this big, sexy Meursault is impressively thick and long. Today, this comes across as the California-style wine in this line-up. Then fat and supple in the mouth, with a strong element of grilled hazelnut. In a fairly thick style but has good energy. Incidentally, Remy pointed out that the 2008s, as a set, display "less ripe fruit aromas than the 2009s but also a lot of sucrosite." A more elegant and higher-toned if not more complex nose puts on display lemon-lime, wet stone and dried floral hints that slide gracefully into pure, detailed, intense and explosive middle weight flavors that possess good mid-palate fat and outstanding persistence on the balanced finish. TASTING NOTE: From 60+ year old vines and the vineyard is a whopping 4 ha monopole within Perrières ... An almost invisible touch of wood influence allows the elegant, ripe and ultra pure aromas of citrus blossom, spice and orchard fruit to have center stage while the focused, textured and almost painfully intense flavors culminate in a bone dry, silky and seriously long finish. As good as the Perrières is, and it's indeed very good, there is simply another dimension present here. Along with the Pucelles, this is highly recommended. Drink 2013+. TASTING NOTE: In barrel and recently raked when I tasted it the Prieur 2007 Montrachet offers an open, expressive personality in striking contrast with its sibling from Chevalier-Montrachet, which seems a bit spare and youthfully strident by comparison. Musk, lime zest, and peach on the nose lead to a palate of honeyed richness, alluring creaminess, and persistent juiciness. Pungent hints of citrus pip and peach kernel mingle with brine, honey, and hints of peat in a long, fascinating finish. Here, one doesn't even give a thought to the perfectly absorbed new wood, nor to the fact that this wine alone from the 2007 Prieur collection comes at all near to 14% alcohol. I expect this will retain its seductiveness and intrigue for at least a decade. Drink till 2019. Score: **93-94** (David Schildknecht, www.erobertparker.com, Dec. 2009)

Scintillating in its combination of textural richness; ripeness of bright citrus and pit fruit; wafting floral perfume; and shimmering expression of salt and chalk, this is an energizing and very treble expression of high-elevation white Burgundy that is apt to thrill lovers of Riesling or Chablis, and apt, too, to be worth following for a half dozen or more years. TASTING NOTE: Here too the elegance of the nose is simply stunning with a layered and perfumed aromatic profile trimmed in an almost invisible touch of oak that allows it to ooze Chablis character and in particular, a fine minerality that continues onto the impressively concentrated and palate staining flavors that possess striking precision on the explosively long and bone dry finish. Large-scaled, opulent and rich, showing a hint of peach but limited primary fruit today. This very closed wine boasts strong acidity and impressive mineral thrust.
